What's new in version 1.10

- The Insight Control Management DVD and integrated installer now support three management suites:
 - HP Insight Control Environment (for ML/DL servers)
 - HP Insight Control Data Center Edition (for BL servers)
 - HP iLO Power Management Pack (for ML/DL servers)
- Insight Control Data Center Edition has added licensing support for HP ProLiant BL685c blade servers. See the HP Insight Control Management Support Matrix for the complete list of servers supported by each management suite.
- The Insight Control Management licensing menu has moved. Select the appropriate menu as follows:
 - To access the Insight Control Environment licensing menu, select Deploy> Insight Control Licenses (ML/DL).
 - To access the Insight Control Data Center Edition licensing menu, select **Deploy>** Insight Control Licenses (BL).
 - To access the Insight Power Manager licenses that comes with iLO Power Management Pack, select Deploy>Licenses menu.
- Insight Control Management provides integrated installation or upgrade of the following component versions:
 - HP Systems Insight Manager (HP SIM) 5.1 (updated) with:
 - HP BladeSystem Integrated Manager 2.3 (updated)
 - HP System Management Homepage 2.1.7 (updated)
 - HP Version Control Repository Manager 2.1.7 (updated)
 - HP Services Essentials Remote Support Pack (new)
 - HP Insight Power Manager 1.0 (new)
 - HP Performance Management Pack 4.3 (updated)
 - HP Rapid Deployment Pack 3.10
 - HP Vulnerability and Patch Management Pack 2.0.3 (updated)
 - HP Virtualization Management Software 2.1 (updated)
- Selection of components for installation is configurable. HP SIM, Insight Power Manager, and Insight Control Management Services are the only required components for installation. All components previously installed are required selections for upgrade.
- Estimates of installation times can be found in the HP Insight Control Management User Guide and HP Insight Control Management Quick Setup Poster.
- Upgrade support from Insight Control Data Center Edition 1.0, 1.0.1, and 1.0.2

- The Insight Control Management Software Update utility connects to the HP website to check for new releases of the components installed by Insight Control Management. If newer versions of installed components are available, the utility provides links to downloads, along with the version numbers and release dates. Available DVD update notifications are also provided for new DVDs. Access the links to download and manually install the updates.
- New support for the Microsoft Internet Explorer 7.0 browser.
- When a user with full configuration rights logs in to HP SIM 5.1 for the first time the HP Systems
 Insight Manager Registration window appears. Register HP SIM or click Register Later. If you do not
 have Internet access, click Register Later.

Installation notes

- To reduce the time required to perform a successful Insight Control Management installation, complete the HP Insight Control Management Installation Checklist Form before beginning the installation. Completing this form ensures that all input required during the installation is readily available. The printed checklist is located in your HP Insight Control Management DVD kit, or the electronic version is available on the DVD.
- For information about the installation and setup of HP Insight Control Management, see the HP Insight Control Management Quick Setup Poster and the HP Insight Control Management User Guide.
- 3. Installation logs can be found in c:\HPIC\logs.
- 4. Insight Control Management does not support Microsoft SQL Express 2005. You must remove SQL Express 2005 from the server before installing Insight Control Management. You can choose to install either Microsoft SQL Server Desktop Engine (MSDE) or use an existing database (Microsoft SQL Server 2000 or Microsoft SQL Server 2005) during the Insight Control Management installation process.
- 5. When executed remotely using the Remote Desktop application, the remote desktop must be started using the /console switch.
- 6. For installations from a network share, the share must be mapped to a network drive (installation directly from the share using UNC is not supported). Also, because a reboot is required in the middle of the installation, the network drive must be connected using the option "reconnect at logon" so the installation can proceed after the system is rebooted.
- 7. When installing from a network drive, the Internet Explorer security level for the Trusted Sites zone must be set to Low. Select Tools>Internet Options>Trusted Sites, and be sure that Security Level for this zone is set to Low.
- 8. Installation on domain controllers is not recommended. However, if you choose to install on a domain controller, disable the SMB Signing Registry Key. If the registry key is not disabled, some Rapid Deployment Pack deployment jobs might not work properly.
- The server automatically reboots once during installation. You will be required to log in so that installation can resume.
- 10. Insight Control Management must be installed using an account password that contains only alphanumeric characters. The following characters may also be used: [,], (,), !, @, -, _, \$, *, comma, period, and space. Do not use a space as the last character in the account password.
- 11. When installing on a Japanese operating system, Japanese characters cannot be used in the user name, password, or installation path fields.
- 12. When installing in an environment with a previously installed remote database, the current user running the HP Insight Control Management installation must have administrator permissions in the database.
- 13. Appropriate data must be entered on the SNMP read community screen before performing an HP SIM discovery for the HP Performance Management Pack to function correctly.

- 14. During the installation of some components, a command prompt might appear. This prompt is a normal part of the installation process and only appears briefly. Do not manually close this window.
- 15. During the Performance Management Pack upgrade process, the HP Performance Management Pack Uninstall window appears. This window is a normal part of the upgrade process and appears only briefly. Do not manually close this window.
- 16. If Rapid Deployment Pack is upgraded, the upgrade process configures the Rapid Deployment Pack deployment to use the primary Network Interface Card (NIC). To configure deployment using a secondary NIC, go to the RDP deployment console, select **Tools>PXE Configuration> DS>Deployment Server IP address**, and change the IP address for the deployment network.
- 17. When reusing a remote Deployment Pack installation, the installer might display an error message stating that Rapid Deployment Pack is not executing on that system. If this occurs, verify that there is no firewall (either native Microsoft® Windows® or a third-party) running on the Rapid Deployment Pack server.
- 18. When using Rapid Deployment Pack or database installations in remote platforms, verify that the firewalls in the remote servers and the HP SIM CMS are configured in such a way that network traffic is permitted to the Rapid Deployment Pack and database ports.
- 19. When reusing Rapid Deployment Pack, the credentials must have administrator permissions in the local server. If the servers are not in a Windows domain, the Rapid Deployment Pack user name must also exist in the local system, and both must have the same password.
- 20. When reusing an existing Rapid Deployment Pack installation, the Deployment Server and Web Console must be installed on the same server to enable Insight Control Management to correctly use the Rapid Deployment Pack.
- 21. When selected, the option to create the virtual directory in IIS FTP service for Rapid Deployment Pack deployments requires that the IIS FTP service must be installed and running in the system.
- 22.To get the Rapid Deployment Pack product operational, load the files of at least one operating system for deployment. You can do this at installation time, in the Deployment Operating Systems screen, or at operation time, using the Rapid Deployment Pack ProLiant Integration Module setup program, located at the rdp\eng\pim directory of the DVD.
- 23. When uninstalling the product, if a warning message mentioning the PXE Configuration Utility appears, click **OK.**
- 24. If the w3wp.exe Application Error message appears during the VPM uninstallation process, click
- 25.PMP can be licensed using a specific PMP license or through the Insight Control Edition/Insight Control Data Center Edition bundle license. When applying a new bundle license to a server previously licensed for PMP, the PMP user interface does not update the licensing status for that server. This issue does not prevent usage of the product, because the license is correctly applied.
- 26. When reusing a local database, if this database does not include the default instance "MSSQLSERVER," the database information does not appear automatically in the corresponding screen of the ICM installer. This database can be reused if you manually enter the required information in the database screen.
- 27. When reusing an HP SIM installation, and Linux operating systems are deployed by Rapid Deployment Pack, manually edit each rapinstall.data file in the HP SIM CMS as follows:
 - CMAMGMTSTATIONROCOMMSTR=<SNMP Community string>
 - CMAMGMTSTATIONROIPORDNS=<CMS IP address>
- 28.If HP SIM is being reused or upgraded and VCRM is already installed, verify that the VCRM repository configuration is using a directory exclusively for this purpose. If the VCRM repository points to the HP SIM root installation directory, parent directory, or sub-directory, the VMS install or upgrade might fail.

Other environment setup requirements

- 1. Insight Control Environment and Insight Control Data Center Edition licenses can only be applied to HP BladeSystem servers that have been correctly identified by HP SIM, with the HP Insight Management Agent installed and system protocol settings defined.
- 2. ASP.NET 1.1 is an installation prerequisite for Insight Control Management. ASP.NET 1.1 is included with Windows 2003 installation, but it is not installed in Microsoft Internet Information Server (IIS) by default. This omission can cause an installation error message to appear.
 - If ASP.NET is not installed, click Start>Control Panel>Add or Remove Programs>
 Add Remove Windows Components>Application Server>Details>ASP.NET, and select the checkbox to add ASP.NET.
 - If issues remain after installing ASP.NET 1.1, other versions of ASP.NET might be installed already. Insight Control Management requires ASP.NET version 1.1 to be registered as a default IIS ASP.NET application handler. The execution of the additional command might be required to register ASP.NET 1.1 as the default handler in IIS:
 - "%windir%\Microsoft.NET\Framework\v1.1.4322\aspnet_regiis.exe" -i

Uninstallation notes

- Insight Control Management might attempt to uninstall System Management Homepage or Version
 Control Repository Manager during the uninstallation process. If you want to keep these items, click
 No when prompted for removal.
- If Insight Control Management is uninstalled, Rapid Deployment Pack operating system deployment files remain in the .\Deployment Server\jobs and .\Deployment Server\lib directories. These files can be manually removed or left on the system to be used with a later reinstallation of the Rapid Deployment Pack.
- After uninstalling Insight Control Management, there might be some remaining files that must be
 manually removed. If an access denied error message appears when removing these files, reboot
 the platform server and then remove the files.

Limitations and known issues in version 1.10

- When a virtual machine (VM) is discovered as an unmanaged system, perform the following steps:
- 1. Log in to HP SIM.
- 2. Select to view a collection that shows the unmanaged systems.
- Select the unmanaged systems.
- 4. From the menu, select Options>Identify Systems..., and click Run Now.
- 5. When identification is complete, go back to step 2 and see if any virtual machines still show as unmanaged. If so, perform steps 3–5 until all systems are managed.
 - After all systems show as managed, they remain in that state, even if another HP SIM discovery is performed.

- The Performance Management Pack uses the IP address of the primary NIC to generate the Online Analysis. If the Performance Management Pack is installed on a system with multiple NICs, the Online Analysis fails to launch from the Tools Menu if the primary NIC is not used. Launch the Online Analysis from the PF column to correctly generate the Online Analysis using the primary NIC.
- When installing the Rapid Deployment Pack using a remote SQL server, the installer terminates with the following error message:

[1030] The package terminated unexpectedly!

To use a remote SQL server with the Rapid Deployment Pack, execute the individual Rapid Deployment Pack installer from the **Products** tab of the Insight Control Management DVD. After the Rapid Deployment Pack installation is complete, execute the Insight Control Management Integrated Installer to install the remaining components.
