NOTE

This application note describes RA8000/ESA12000 FC-Switched Fabric configurations. For Fibre Channel Arbitrated Loop configurations, refer to Application Notes "RA8000/ESA12000 FC-AL Configurations for Windows NT – Intel" and "RA8000/ESA12000 FC-AL High Availability Configurations for Windows NT – Intel".

Enterprise Network Storage Architecture (ENSA)

Compaq StorageWorks RAID Array 8000 (RA8000 FC) and Enterprise Storage Array 12000 (ESA12000 FC) products are the latest in fully integrated Fibre Channel RAID storage solutions. These products provide the key steps in delivering on Compaq's ENSA vision. ENSA addresses the issues that our customers expect to face now and in the future. Both products address today's issues including: economical capacity growth, data protection, high availability, increased distance, multivendor platform support, and investment protection by being the base for building the ENSA vision.

With the addition of fibre channel switched fabric support in the RA8000 and ESA12000 FC storage products, Compaq has taken the next evolutionary step in delivery of the ENSA vision. Our customers can now realize the full benefits of a Storage Area Network (SAN) providing exceptional connectivity while increasing the effective bandwidth of the network. Fibre Channel Fabric provides the robust backbone needed to address dispersed server operation with shared storage access across the enterprise.

Product Overview

The RA8000 and ESA12000 FC storage systems are based on a common architecture and offer customers centralized management, high availability, and exceptional performance and scalability in open systems environments. These products provide a Fibre Channel storage solution with industry leading SAN support utilizing both FC-Fabric (switch) and FC-AL (arbitrated loop) technology.

The RA8000 FC is a mid-range storage system available in a pedestal enclosure for departmental use in the office. It can also be installed in server racks for small data centers. An easy-to-deploy, flexible solution for open systems, the RA8000 supports up to 2.6 TB of storage.

The ESA12000 FC, designed for the data center, is available in three easy-to-order building blocks, each optimized for specific, high-capacity customer requirements. The ESA12000 FC offers unprecedented levels of storage, scaling in performance and capacity as user requirements increase.

These storage systems incorporate the latest in RAID technology providing RAID levels 0, 1, 0+1, adaptive 3/5, and non-RAID disks. Compaq's implementation of RAID capability assures that data availability will be maintained despite hardware failure. Features such as read ahead cache and mirrored write back cache improve or minimize the affect on performance while preserving data availability and supporting high availability.

The RA8000/ESA12000 FC platform kits contain the necessary operating system specific software and documentation needed to install, configure, and monitor your storage system. All platform kits include the StorageWorks Command Console (SWCC) for storage management operations including configuring, status inquiry and notification facilities. SWCC provides a user oriented graphical user interface (GUI) simplifying the most complex of storage management operations.

Microsoft Cluster Server (MSCS)

A Windows NT MSCS cluster enables two servers to share an RA8000 or ESA12000 FC storage system through a Fibre Channel bus. If a server failure should occur, the storage I/O is re-routed through to the functioning server. This process, called cluster failover, requires no resource downtime ensuring the high availability of data.

The RA8000 and ESA12000 FC storage systems are supported in Windows NT MSCS cluster configurations. All of the cluster configurations provide full cluster failover capabilities through a fibre channel bus connected to both cluster servers.

In addition to cluster failover, the RAID array controllers can be configured in transparent failover mode to protect against the unlikely event of a single controller failure. This feature eliminates controllers as single points of failure and is invoked without the need for server intervention.

For the highest availability, two hardware paths between the cluster servers and the RA8000 or ESA12000 FC storage system can be configured using Compaq's Secure Path for Windows NT. This configuration provides two separate physical paths between the servers and the storage.

Secure Path for Windows NT

StorageWorks Secure Path is a high availability software product providing continuous data access for RA8000 and ESA12000 FC storage products configured on Windows NT platforms. Redundant hardware, advanced RAID technology and automated failover capability are used to enhance fault tolerance and availability. Secure Path effectively eliminates controllers, interconnect hardware and host bus adapters as single points of failure in the storage system.

Key to Secure Path's functionality is the capability of RA8000/ESA12000 FC dual HSG80 controllers to operate in the active/active Multiple-Bus failover mode. This failover mode allows each controller to be configured on its own bus and to process I/O independently under normal operation. Available storage units are "preferred" to one or the other of the two controllers which determines which controller path is used for access at system boot time. During runtime, storage units may be moved between paths at anytime through use of the management utility.

Controllers in Multiple-Bus failover mode monitor each other and automatically failover storage units from the failed member of a controller pair. The Secure Path software detects the failure of I/O operations to complete on a failed path and automatically re-routes all traffic to the surviving path. Controller and path failover is completed seamlessly, without process disruption or data loss.

The Secure Path management utility provides continuous monitoring capability and identifies failed paths and failed-over storage units. To facilitate static load balancing, storage units can be moved between paths using simple "drag-and-drop" operations.

The integration of Secure Path, Windows NT Clustering, and StorageWorks RAID Array Fibre Channel technology provides the maximum level of fault-tolerance, data availability, and performance required for mission-critical environments.

Performance Considerations

The performance of an application on a system that includes RA8000 or ESA12000 FC storage can be limited by many different components of the system. Some of the possible component limitations include the host CPU(s), memory size, the host bus adapter(s) (HBA), the fibre channel bus, the RAID controller, or the specific configuration of disks used behind the controller. The limiting factor can move to any of these components depending on the workload. Identifying the limits will assist in determining the best configuration for a given application.

Table 1 lists the upper limit performance specifications for the components of the RA8000 and ESA12000 FC storage systems based on testing using standard storage performance tests and methodologies. These numbers should be used to compare component level performance as a means to determine the best configuration from a performance perspective. User application tests may not necessarily reach these levels of performance as applications may perform additional levels of processing for each I/O. The controller specifications listed show both cache (no disk access) and media (with disk access) limitations.

The limits are based on I/O performance (I/O's per second) - typical of small transfer applications such as databases and mail, and bandwidth performance (MB's per second) - typical of large transfer applications such as video and graphics.

NOTE

FC Switch performance limits are theoretical. Actual measured performance is lower due to limits unrelated to the switch.

General Configuration Guidelines

One of the major benefits of fibre channel fabric technology is the ability to optimize and tailor configurations to best meet your specific needs today, while at the same time provide you the flexibility to expand your storage network as needed to address future needs. Consider future as well as present needs when determining the optimal initial configurations.

Configuration Maximums

This application note describes two RA8000/ESA12000 FC Windows NT switch configurations based on the configuration maximums for servers and storage systems per fibre channel switch (or switches). This document is not intended to describe all possible configurations, as the potential for fibre channel switch configurations is too numerous to define or illustrate. The configuration maximums should be used as a guide to determine the viability of a proposed configuration. It is strongly recommended that you not exceed the maximums listed.

- 500 meters per optical cable segment, 1 kilometer distance between server and storage
- The maximum number of FC HBAs per server is 4 (or total allowed in the server if less than 4)
- Fibre channel switches Any combination of NT Servers and RA8000/ESA12000 storage systems is allowed per switch, provided these rules are followed:
 - 1. A maximum of 8 NT servers (assumes one FC HBA per server) per RA8000 or ESA12000 dual controller storage system. See "Extended Configurations" description below when 5 or more servers have access to the same HSG80 controller host port.
 - 2. A maximum of 4 RA8000 or ESA12000 (with 1 controller pair) can be configured on a FC 16-port switch (Note: If you configure all 4 HSG80 ports on each storage system the maximum is 3 RA8000 or ESA12000 storage systems per 16-port switch).
 - 3. A maximum of 4 RA8000 or ESA12000 (with 1 controller pair) can be configured across two FC switches for high availability. Refer to SAN Configuration 2 for specific support rules related to Secure Path for Windows NT.
 - 4. Cascading of switches is currently not allowed (supported in a future release).
- Extended Configurations If you configure 5 or more (up to 8) Windows NT servers (assumes one FC HBA per server) for access to a single host port on an RA8000/ESA12000 Fibre Channel storage system, you must select the "Extended Configuration" check box in the StorageWorks Platform Kit Fibre Channel Software Setup utility custom installation setup. Each NT server that comprises this configuration must have the option selected. Selecting this option will adjust registry settings for your KGPSA host bus adapter to operate in an "Extended Configuration" environment.
- The maximum storage capacity stated (2.6 TB) assumes 36GB disks, increases in disk drive capacity will increase overall storage capacity for the same enclosure footprint
- Intermixing of standalone, NT Cluster, and Secure Path configurations on a switch is allowed provided the rules listed above are followed.

General Configuration Notes

- Dual redundant controllers can be configured for Transparent Failover Mode or Multiple-Bus Failover Mode
- All configuration diagrams show a front view of the storage system, Controller A is the top controller; Controller B is the bottom controller. Controller Host Port 1 is the left port; Host Port 2 is the right port
- Each storage system can be configured using SWCC or the Command Line Interface (CLI) through either the HSG80 controller maintenance serial port or a TCP/IP interface
- All configurations utilize ACS V8.4F (Array Controller Software) configured for FC-FABRIC topology
- All configurations utilize short wavelength lasers and multi-mode fibre channel optical cables in each cable segment. Label both ends of each FC cable with the same unique identification marking (number, letter, etc.) prior to installation

- All configurations require the Connection Name Operating System parameter set to "WINNT"
- By default the HSG80 Command Console LUN (CCL) is enabled. This must be **disabled for Windows NT** (using the CLI, "SET *controller* NOCOMMAND CONSOLE LUN")
- For configurations with more than one server accessing through the same HSG80 controller host port,
 - Use the Connection Name *Unit Offset* value to set the range of unit numbers to be visible from each server (using the CLI, "SET *connection-name* UNIT_OFFSET = n")

Use the Unit *Connection Name* parameter to allow exclusive access to units from each server (using the CLI, "SET unit-number DISABLE_ACCESS_PATH = ALL ENABLE ACCESS PATH = *connection-name*")

• All Multiple-Bus Failover configurations require Compaq Secure Path for Windows NT (minimum revision v2.2)

For standalone servers (non-cluster), a separate instance of the Secure Path Manager is run on each server.

For Windows NT Clusters, one instance of the Secure Path Manager can be run

Use the Unit Preferred Path parameter to assign units to a specific controller

Distribute units equally across both controllers for proper load balancing

Secure Path configurations require two FC HBAs in a server. Each FC HBA must be connected to a *different* FC switch, and for cable symmetry, should be on the *same* switch port number, for example:

Server 1 FC HBA 1 to FC Switch 1 - Switch Port 1 Server 1 FC HBA 2 to FC Switch 2 - Switch Port 1 Server 2 FC HBA 1 to FC Switch 1 - Switch Port 2 Server 2 FC HBA 2 to FC Switch 2 - Switch Port 2

The Secure Path Manager uses order of discovery to determine which path (controller) will be displayed first in the GUI, thus FC HBA PCI slot number and switch port cabling affect the display order. The Secure Path Manager will display the controller connected to the first FC HBA (lowest PCI slot number in the server) as the top path and label it as "CONTROLLER A". The controller connected to the FC HBA in the next highest PCI slot is the bottom path in the display labeled as "CONTROLLER B"

- Record the FC HBA *Worldwide ID* (WWID) IEEE address shown on the back of each FC HBA prior to installing into a server
- Use the recorded WWID to identify the connection name displayed from the CLI at the controller using the "SHOW CONNECTIONS" command
- Rename connection names. By default new connection names are automatically added to the controller connection name table by the controllers when they detect a path to an adapter from each active controller host port. The default connection name assigned by the controllers will be "!NEWCONnn", where nn is a number from 1 to 32. After the controllers detect all paths, rename each connection name to be more meaningful to the configuration i.e., SERVER1P1, SERVER1P2, etc. (connection names can be a maximum of 9 characters)
- Each active controller host port presents one SCSI Target ID with up to eight LUNs to each server (FC HBA) on the same switch. LUNs (logical units) can consist of single disks (JBOD), a storageset of multiple disks or a partition (up to 8), configured for a specific RAID level of 0, 1, 0 + 1, or 3/5

Configuration Descriptions

Table 2 lists two RA8000 and ESA12000 FC-Fabric SAN maximum configurations for Windows NT and the pages of this document where a description of capacities, configuration notes, and performance considerations are provided. The configurations are based on the maximums listed in the general configuration guideline section. They show the limits with regard to:

- Number of servers and storage systems per FC switch
- High Availability No Single Point of Failure Servers per RA8000 or ESA12000 FC dual controller

SAN configuration 1 describes maximums with the RA8000 and ESA12000 HSG80 controllers configured in controller Transparent Failover Mode. SAN configuration 2 describes the maximums when using controller Multiple-Bus Failover Mode with Compaq Secure Path for Windows NT software. All Transparent failover configurations allow the flexibility to trade-off server and storage system count based on FC switch port availability. All configurations support a mix of both clustered and non-clustered (MSCS) servers. All configurations illustrated utilize 16-port FC switches. The 8-port FC switch is supported in the same configuration types with less connectivity due to the reduced number of ports available.

SAN Configuration 1 - One FC 16-Port Switch - Up to Eight Servers or Up to Four Storage Systems, Controller Transparent Failover




Figure 1 SAN Configuration 1

SAN Configuration 1 (Figure 1) shows the maximum server connectivity currently supported through a single 16-port FC switch. Up to eight separate (non-cooperating) servers or up to four pairs of clustered (cooperating) servers can be connected through the switch providing access from all servers to a single storage system. This configuration utilizes the high connectivity and high performance capabilities of the FC 16-port switch. The HSG80 array controllers within the RA8000 or ESA12000 storage enclosure are configured in Transparent failover mode providing full controller redundancy in the unlikely event of either controller failing. In the initial configuration two active controller host ports provide up to 128 LUNs across up to 24 disks (48 for ESA12000 48 disk). Additional disks can be added using expansion enclosures. With a single 16-port FC switch you can connect up to 2 storage systems with 8 servers or reduce the server count and connect up to 4 storage systems.

SAN Configuration 1 Notes

- Single 16-port Fibre Channel Switch
- Up to 8 servers, clustered or non-clustered
- Shared storage enclosure(s)
- HSG80 controllers configured in Transparent Failover Mode
- Additional HSG80 controllers configured in Transparent Failover Mode
- Up to 500 meters per cable segment
- Up to 72 disks with 2 optional expansion enclosures per storage system
- Standard configuration With 8 servers, up to 64 LUNs, 8 available to each server
- Extended configuration With 8 servers, up to 128 LUNs, 16 available to each server
- Rename the connection names, i.e., SERVER1P1, SERVER2P1, SERVER1P2, etc.
- Set the connection name unit offset values. By default, setting the controller pairs in Transparent

- failover mode will automatically configure Port 1 and Port 2 of both controllers to the Active and
- Standby state indicated, and set unit offset values to 0 for Port 1 and 100 for Port 2. Use the default connection unit offset values for two of the servers and set new unit offset values for connections to the other ten servers as shown below.
- Set exclusive unit access for each unit to a specific server connection name, i.e., for unit D0 ENABLE = SERVER1P1, for unit D100 ENABLE = SERVER7P2.
- Suggested unit numbering and connection parameters for 8 servers/8 LUNs per server results in the units being divided equally across controller host ports as follows:

Server 1: Port 1 units D0 – D7 Connection name, unit offset value: SERVER1P1, 0 Server 2: Port 1 units D10 – D17 Connection name, unit offset value: SERVER2P1, 10 Server 3: Port 1 units D20 – D27 Connection name, unit offset value: SERVER3P1, 20 Server 4: Port 1 units D30 - D37 Connection name, unit offset value: SERVER4P1, 30 Server 5: Port 2 units D100 - D107 Connection name, unit offset value: SERVER5P1, 100 Server 6: Port 2 units D110 – D117 Connection name, unit offset value: SERVER6P1, 110 Server 7: Port 2 units D120 – D127 Connection name, unit offset value: SERVER7P2, 120 Server 8: Port 2 units D130 - D137 Connection name, unit offset value: SERVER8P2, 130

NOTE

The listed connection parameters utilize a single connection to each server – either Port 1 or Port 2. Utilizing both Port 1 and Port 2 connections on all servers and selecting the "Extended Configuration" option in the FC software setup utility can double the number of LUNs available to each server.

SAN Configuration 1 Performance Considerations

This configuration is meant to show the high connectivity available through a single FC switch. It utilizes a single 16-port FC Switch with up to 8 servers and 2 dual controller storage systems. Assuming that all 8 servers are not always accessing the HSG80 array controllers with the same intensity, the potential throughput and bandwidth available to a single server in this configuration is the dual HSG80 two active port limit of 24,000(cache)/13,000(media) I/O/sec and 154(cache)/102(media) MB/sec. Conversely, when there is simultaneous access, the servers will share the total available resources of the two array controllers. Based on your specific application performance needs, you may consider adding additional controllers and/or reducing the server count.

SAN Configuration 2 – Two FC 16-Port Switches - Up to Eight Servers, Up to Four Storage Systems, Secure Path, Controller Multiple-Bus Failover




Figure 2 SAN Configuration 2

SAN Configuration 2 (Figure 2) shows the maximum server and storage connectivity available for high availability applications when the storage systems are configured in Multiple-Bus failover mode. Up to eight separate (non-cooperating) servers or up to four pairs of clustered (cooperating) servers can be connected through two 16-port FC switches with up to 4 storage systems. This configuration adds the high availability features of Multiple-Bus failover and Secure Path for Windows NT software. With Secure Path for Windows NT, two FC HBAs in each server, and two FC switches, a second separate path to the storage is provided to each server. In this configuration up to eight active controller host ports provide up to 256 LUNs across up to 288 disks.

- Secure Path v2.2 (Minimum revision) Up to 4 storage systems total, Multiple-Bus Failover Mode
- Two 16-port Fibre Channel Switches
- Up to 8 servers
- Shared storage enclosure(s)
- Up to 4 HSG80 controller pairs configured in Multiple-Bus Failover Mode or Transparent Failover Mode
- Up to 500 meters per cable segment
- Up to 288 disks with 2 optional expansion enclosures per storage system
- With 8 servers and 4 storage systems, up to 256 LUNs, 32 available to each server
- Set the Unit Preferred Path. Use the Preferred Path unit parameter to distribute units equally across controllers for load balancing as shown below

It is suggested that FC HBA and controller port cabling be symmetric, for example: Server 1 FC HBA 1 to FC Switch 1 - Switch Port 1 Server 1 FC HBA 2 to FC Switch 2 - Switch Port 1 Server 2 FC HBA 1 to FC Switch 1 - Switch Port 2 Server 2 FC HBA 2 to FC Switch 2 - Switch Port 2 Controller Enclosure 1, Controller A Port 1 to FC Switch 1 - Switch Port 0 Controller Enclosure 1, Controller B Port 1 to FC Switch 2 – Switch Port 0 Controller Enclosure 2. Controller A Port 1 to FC Switch 1 – Switch Port 3 Controller Enclosure 2, Controller B Port 1 to FC Switch 2 – Switch Port 3 • Rename the connection names, i.e., SRV1A1P1, SRV2A2P1, SRV5A1P1, etc. Set the connection name unit offset values for each connection as shown below. Set exclusive unit access for each unit to a specific server connection name, i.e., for unit D0 ENABLE = SRV1A1P1, SRV1A2P1, for unit D100 ENABLE = SRV5A1P1, SRV5A2P1. Suggested unit numbering, preferred paths, and connection parameters for 8 servers and 1 storage system results in the units being divided equally across controller host ports as follows: Server 1: Port 1 units D0 – D7. Prefer D0 - D3 to Controller A, D4 - D7 to Controller B Connection names, unit offset value: SRV1A1P1, 0. SRV1A2P1, 0 Server 2: Port 1 units D10 – D17. Prefer D10 - D13 to Controller A, D14 - D17 to Controller B Connection name, unit offset value: SRV2A1P1, 10. SRV2A2P1, 10 Server 3: Port 1 units D20 – D27. Prefer D20 - D23 to Controller A, D24 - D27 to Controller B Connection name, unit offset value: SRV3A1P1, 20. SRV3A2P1, 20 Server 4: Port 1 units D30 – D37. Prefer D30 - D33 to Controller A. D34 - D37 to Controller B Connection name, unit offset value: SRV4A1P1, 30, SRV4A2P1, 30 Server 5: Port 1 units D40 – D47. Prefer D40 - D43 to Controller A, D44 - D47 to Controller B Connection name, unit offset value: SRV5A1P1, 40. SRV5A2P1, 40 Server 6: Port 1 units D50 – D57. Prefer D50 - D53 to Controller A, D54 - D57 to Controller B Connection name, unit offset value: SRV6A1P1, 50. SRV6A2P1, 50 Server 7: Port 1 units D60 – D67. Prefer D60 - D63 to Controller A, D64 - D67 to Controller B Connection name, unit offset value: SRV7A1P1, 60. SRV7A2P1, 60 Server 8: Port 2 units D70 – D77. Prefer D70 – D73 to Controller A, D74 – D77 to Controller B Connection name, unit offset value: SRV8A1P1, 100. SRV8A2P1, 100

NOTE

The listed connection parameters assume eight servers and a single storage subsystem. If additional storage systems are utilized, units for all servers can be assigned equally across all storage systems as shown above, or specific servers can assign all units to specific storage systems exclusively.

SAN Configuration 2 Performance Considerations

This configuration shows the maximum connectivity available in a high availability storage configuration with dual paths to the storage. It utilizes two 16-port FC Switches with up to 8 servers and up to 4 dual controller storage systems. Assuming that all 8 servers are not always accessing the 8 HSG80 array controllers with the same intensity, the potential throughput and bandwidth available to a single server in a maximum configuration is the 4 times the dual HSG80 two active port limit for a total of 96,000(cache)/32,800(media) I/O/sec and 616(cache)/408(media) MB/sec. Conversely, when there is simultaneous access, the servers will share the total available resources of the 8 array controllers.

Product Details

The RA8000/ESA12000 storage systems utilize the Compaq HSG80 RAID controller running Array Controller Software (ACS) V8.4F. The ACS software is designed to support multiple platforms providing features including: dual controller operation, two controller failover modes – Transparent and Multiple-Bus, mirrored write back cache, read ahead cache, RAID implementation, disk mirroring, and disk partitioning capabilities. In addition, ACS manages host interconnect and protocol services to provide data for event notification and status such as displayed by SWCC.

The HSG80 controller has two FC host ports providing up to a total of nearly 200 Mbytes per second of available bandwidth. Disk drives are connected to the controller through 6 UltraSCSI channels providing up to 40 Mbytes per second per channel of available bandwidth. Servers can use multiple host bus adapters (HBAs) to multiple RA8000 FC systems for unlimited storage capacity.

The RA8000 FC is supplied in two basic building blocks, a pedestal style cabinet and what has been termed a "rackable" model. The pedestal is a self-contained desk height cabinet, it is available in Digital Classic Top Gun blue and in Compaq Opal. The rackable is shipped ready to be mounted in a 19" Compaq rack or a 19"cabinet/rack using an included universal RETMA/metric mounting kit.

RA8000 FC controllers come with 64 MB of cache. Cache options allow for 128 MB, 256 MB and 512MB of cache in each controller. ESA12000 FC controllers come with 256 MB of cache. Cache options allow for 512MB of cache in each controller. Cache features include read ahead and mirrored write back cache for use in optimizing performance where redundant capabilities are required for high availability system configurations. In the rare event that a storage controller fails the mirrored data is immediately available to the remaining controller for continuing operation.

The RA8000 FC pedestals and rackables come in both single controller and in dual controller models to allow the customer to select the level of high availability required for their application. A single controller model can be upgraded to a dual controller model when warranted by the application.

High availability is supported by the use of redundancy and hot swappable components. The RA8000 FC disk enclosures include redundant cooling, and have 5 power supplies providing N+1 redundancy. Power can be upgraded to full redundancy with the addition of 3 more supplies and a 2nd power distribution unit for AC input redundancy. StorageWorks components are "hot" swappable including storage controllers when operating as a redundant pair.

You can configure and monitor the RA8000 and ESA12000 FC using the StorageWorks Command Console (SWCC). SWCC is included in the HSG80 Software Solutions Platform kit. Using this client/server tool, you can configure RAID sets locally or over a TCP/IP network. The client provides an easy to use graphical user interface. It can be used to monitor your storage system and notify you of events by updating a graphical display, sending electronic mail, or alerting via a pager. The Command Console Client includes applications (or Storage Windows) that communicate with the Command Console Agent software running on the host platform.

The Command Console client is available on Windows 95 and on Intel/Alpha platforms running Windows NT. A Storage Window for the HSG80 controller supports the Array Controller Software (ACS) V8.4F and offers integration with Compaq's Insight Manager(CIM). Insight Manager can receive SNMP traps from the Command Console Agent and Insight Manager services can directly launch SWCC for notification or configuring operations.
