Important Notice Regarding Cache Sizes

For ACS Version 8.7, minimum cache size requirements are 128 MB in unmirrored configurations, and 256 MB in mirrored configurations, per cache module.

The cache size requirements for running ACS Version 8.7P or Version 8.7S remain at 512 MB.

Identifying ACS Revision Level

The ACS release package you received should include a PCMCIA program card containing the new ACS software. Included in this section are instructions for determining the ACS version running on your RAID Array.

Once ACS is installed, you can identify the specific version of ACS by typing the following command at the CLI prompt:

HSG80> SHOW THIS_CONTROLLER

The resulting display lists the software revision level as one of the following:

V87G V87F V87P V87S

If the ACS version is not Version 8.7 or a subsequently patched version of ACS Version 8.7, contact your support provider for instructions on how to obtain the updated version.

If the ACS version is Version 8.7P or Version 8.7S, you need additional layered application software beyond this Solution Software Kit to take advantage of the added functionality of these versions. See "Layered Software Applications", page 26, for additional information on compatible layered application software.

ACS Version 8.7 is fully compatible with Version 8.7B Solution Software. In addition, Version 8.7B Solution Software is backward compatible with ACS Version 8.6, which benefits the upgrade process across your SAN.

IMPORTANT: This does not apply to Windows Server 2003. Windows Server 2003 is compatible with ACS V8.7-1 or higher.

Patching ACS

Each ACS patch builds on the current version of ACS and all previously installed patches. ACS patches must be installed in order, from lowest to highest, when multiple patches are installed. ACS patches are available for download from the following *StorageWorks* website:

ACS patch downloads come packaged with the instructions and scripts needed to apply the patch. See the *HSG80 Array Controller ACS Version 8.7 Maintenance and Service Guide* for further information on patching ACS.

For multi-bus configurations, use the following procedure in addition to those provided with the ACS patch download:

- 1. Apply ACS patches to both controllers.
- 2. Move all units to OTHER_CONTROLLER, one unit at a time, using Secure Path software. Moving the units in this manner is not a requirement, but it lets the controller do less work than when moving all the units at once.

- 3. Reboot THIS_CONTROLLER during a slow time (when controllers are running at more than 50% idle). The patch takes effect once the controller is rebooted.
- 4. Repeat these steps for OTHER_CONTROLLER by moving all units to THIS_CONTROLLER and rebooting OTHER_CONTROLLER during a slow time.

ACS Patch Memory

Any installed ACS Version 8.6 (or lower) patches should be removed after an ACS Version 8.7 installation since they are no longer applicable. This frees up HSG80 patch memory for future ACS patches.

To check or remove ACS patches, run the Code Load and Code Patch utility by typing the following command:

HSG80> RUN CLCP

Multiple Storage System Types

The extended interoperability of the heterogeneous SAN allows you to mix several types of *StorageWorks* storage systems. *StorageWorks* recommends the following configuration rules when different storage products are shared in the same SAN:

- HSG80 ACS Version 8.7 and EVA VCS Version 2.x or 3.x—Use ACS Solution Software Version 8.7B (includes SWCC Version 2.5) or VCS Version 3.0B (includes SSSU).
- HSG80 ACS Version 8.6 and EVA VCS Version 2.0—Use ACS Solution Software Version 8.6 (if SWCC Version 2.4 components are desired) and VCS Version 2.0 compatible multi-bus software/drivers.
- HSG80 ACS Version 8.6 and EVA VCS Version 2.x or 3.x—Use ACS Solution Software Version 8.7B (includes SWCC Version 2.5) or VCS Version 3.0B (includes SSSU).

NOTE: Any multiple storage system configuration that includes EVA VCS Version 2.x or 3.x requires multi-bus support. See "Secure Path Software", page 25, for compatible Secure Path versions. ACS Version 8.7 compatible Secure Path versions and HBA drivers are compatible with VCS Version 2.x or 3.x.

New Features

This section briefly describes new features and changes that are supported by the Version 8.7B release of the Solution Software together with the array controller running ACS Version 8.7.

New Features for 8.7B

The following are major enhancements included in the 8.7B release of the Solution Software Kit.

- Windows Server 2003—Solution Software Kits now support Windows Server 2003, 32-bit.
- **Blade Servers**—Solution Software Kits for Windows now support ProLiant Blade Servers BL20p and BL40p (Windows 2000 and Windows Server 2003 only).
- Secure Path Version—A new version is now supported for both Windows 2000 and Windows Server 2003 and is required for ProLiant Blade Server support but is not included in this kit.
- **Rapid Deployment Pack**—Added support for ProLiant Essentials Rapid Deployment Pack which provides automated server deployment and redeployment via a central console using imaging and scripting technologies for ProLiant servers. The deployment console provides simple drag-and-drop functionality for deployment events. The Solution Software Kit CD-ROM contains software components, drivers, and utilities that are located in the \rdp directory. See readme.txt on the CD-ROM for a more detailed description of Rapid Deployment Pack, installation instructions, and restrictions. ACS Feature Enhancements

The following major enhancements are included in the ACS Version 8.7 release:

- **Host Connection Table Locking**—Host table lock and unlock commands were added to control the connection table in NVRAM. When the table is locked, the host login request is rejected (unless the connection is already in the table), and the request is stored internally on a rejected hosts table.
- Selective Management Presentation—Selective Management Presentation extends the use of Selective Storage Presentation by providing control over which SAN Management Agent systems (if any) can perform management operations.
- **VENDOR_ID Field**—ACS now provides a VENDOR_ID field at the bottom of the **Extended information** area, returned by the SHOW THIS FULL or SHOW OTHER FULL commands.

- Linked WWIDs for Snap and Clone Units—To better manage snap and clone unit creation, a linked WWID scheme was implemented. It keeps the WWIDs of these units constant each time they are created. The linked WWID scheme reduces the number of system data records needed to track unit WWIDs, and enhances the stability of administrative scripts used in unit creation.
- SMART Error Drive Eject—In prior versions of ACS, SMART error notifications received from a device were treated as soft (recovered) errors. The notification was passed to the host and operations continued. ACS now provides a CLI switch (SMART error eject state) that offers an alternative to this behavior.

With the new switch enabled, drives in a normalized and redundant set that report a SMART error are removed from that set. SMART errors reported by drives in a non-redundant or non-normal set continue to be treated as recovered errors. If the switch is disabled, all SMART errors are treated as recovered errors.

• Error Threshold for Drives—ACS now provides the ability to set limits for drive errors. Once the limit is reached, the questionable drive is removed from any redundant set it is a member of and put into the failed set. Errors counted are medium and recovered errors. Hardware errors are not included in this count since the drive fails immediately when a hardware error is encountered.

Modular Array Solutions

The modular solution consists of the array controller (single or dual configurations) installed in a Model 2200 Ultra SCSI controller enclosure, and the drives installed in either a Model 4314 disk enclosure or a Model 4354 disk enclosure. The modular solutions must be mounted in RETMA cabinets. The *StorageWorks* RETMA cabinets are available in heights of 42U, 41U, 36U, and 22U. The Model 2200 Ultra SCSI controller enclosure is 4U. The Model 4314 disk enclosure and the Model 4354 disk enclosure are both 3U. This combination allows for several cabinet configurations.

NOTE: If you wish to use a controller from an existing RA8000 or ESA12000 storage system, the Cache Bulkhead upgrade for installation of the controller in the Model 2200 is required.

Disk Enclosures

The array controller firmware addresses up to 14 disks per SCSI bus. The maximum number of disks supported by an array controller (single or cooperating pair) is 84. The disk enclosures can be configured for single bus or for dual bus operation.

NOTE: The 43xx disk enclosures do not allow daisy chaining between shelves.

Ordering Modular Storage Systems

The Modular Array/Enterprise Modular Array storage systems can be ordered in one of the following three ways:

- Predefined models are available that provide a set number of controller shelves and drive shelves in a Modular Storage Cabinet:
 - MA8000: One Model 2200 controller enclosure and three dual bus Model 4354 disk enclosures in a 22U Modular Storage Cabinet
 - EMA12000 D14: Three Model 2200 controller enclosures and nine dual bus Model 4354 disk enclosures in a 42U Modular Storage Cabinet
 - EMA12000 S14: One Model 2200 controller enclosure and six single bus Model 4314 disk enclosures in a 36U Modular Storage Cabinet
 - EMA12000 Blue: One Model 2200 controller enclosure and three dual bus Model 4354 disk enclosures in a 41U Modular Storage Cabinet
 - EMA16000 S14: Two Model 2200 controller enclosures and twelve single bus 4314 disk enclosures in a 41U Modular Storage Cabinet
 - EMA16000 D14: Four Model 2200 controller enclosures with twelve dual bus 4354 disk enclosures in a 41U Modular Storage Cabinet

NOTE: The predefined models require the following options: Controllers, ECBs, Controller firmware and drives.

- Configure-to-Order. Allows you to specify the number of controller shelves and drive shelves desired in a Modular Storage Cabinet.
- Assembly onsite. Allows you to order the components separately and install them in any supported RETMA rack or cabinet.

StorageWorks Command Console

SWCC Version 2.5 is included in this release. Version 2.5 is used to identify the SWCC suite of components.

SWCC provides a graphical user interface that can be used to configure and monitor your storage system. Use of SWCC is highly recommended, but not required. The SWCC Agent is installed as part of the Solution Software Kit.

For more information on SWCC installation, see the *HSG80 ACS Solution Software Version 8.7 Installation and Configuration Guide*. For more information on SWCC Client operation, see the *Command Console Version 2.5 User Guide* and the *Command Console Version 2.5 Release Notes*.

SWCC Scalability

- The SWCC Client can monitor up to 128 host systems, each with up to 32 storage systems, for a maximum of 4096 concurrent storage connections and a total of 2.65 PB of storage.
- One Agent can support up to 32 Clients.

Multiple Agents

This Solution Software Kit contains an SWCC Agent that supports controller locking during CLI command execution, which allows support for multiple Agents. This locking feature is required in order to use the Management Appliance in addition to the host-based SWCC Agent. However, it is not recommended or required to use multiple Agents for any other purpose.

NOTE: SWCC Agent Version 2.3.2, Build 77 or higher supports the locking feature. This release of Solution Software exceeds this requirement.

Multiple Management Sessions

Though multiple clients can be used to monitor your storage system, *StorageWorks* recommends that only one instance of storage system management be active at a time. The client does allow for multiple management sessions, but there are no ownership rights given to any particular session. Without a highly coordinated effort, multiple management sessions can undermine the integrity of system maintenance. This same principle applies to multiple management sessions initiated through the Management Appliance as well.

SWCC Client Installation

The SWCC client software is installed on your host system from the *StorageWorks* Solution Software CD-ROM.

- 1. Insert the Solution Software CD-ROM into the host system. A menu appears on your screen.
- 2. If the program does not start automatically after inserting the CD-ROM, go to the CD-ROM drive directory and run the launch.exe file.
- 3. The installation program provides one primary option: Solution Software for Windows.
 - a. If you are just installing SWCC, skip the driver upgrade screen.
 - b. Select **SWCC** to install.
 - c. Select **HSG80 Controller for ACS85 or newer** and complete the installation as prompted.

Secure Path Software

ACS Feature Support

The following sections provide details for specific ACS features.

Maximum Host Connections

The maximum number of host connections is 96 for the table of known connections. A connection is unique to the node WWN, port WWN, and controller port. This table is maintained in the NVRAM of the controller. If the table contains 96 entries, new connections cannot be added unless unused entries are deleted. Otherwise, a host attempting FC login is rejected from becoming a connection into the connection table, but not necessarily from the fabric.

Rolling Upgrades

This section supersedes both the rolling upgrade and ACS upgrade procedures found in the HSG80 ACS Solution Software Version 8.7 for Windows NT and Windows 2000 Installation and Configuration Guide.

Operating Constraints

When performing rolling upgrades on the HSG80 array controller, the following rules and guidelines apply:

- Rolling upgrades must occur in succession. For example, you must upgrade from V8.6 to V8.7-1.
- If you are performing a rolling upgrade, ensure that the variant for the existing ACS version being upgraded is the same as that of the next version to be upgraded. For example, if you want to upgrade ACS V8.6P-10, the ACS version to be upgraded must be the P variant of ACS V8.7-*x*.
- You must use a dual-redundant configuration to perform rolling upgrades.
- If you are upgrading the P variant of an applicable ACS version, use the procedures provided in the *hp StorageWorks HSG80 Array Controller Version 8.7 Maintenance and Service Guide*. This guide provides specific instructions on upgrading ACS on the initiator and target site.

• You must upgrade the Solution Software Kit before performing the rolling upgrade procedure in the "Upgrading ACS" section.



CAUTION: HP *StorageWorks* Secure Path V3.1A for Windows, Service Pack (SP) 3 or Secure Path V4.0-1 or higher for Windows must be used before performing the rolling upgrade procedure in the "Upgrading ACS" section. If you don't, data loss may occur.

Solution Software Kit Upgrade Procedures

Use the procedures in this and the following sections to upgrade your Solution Software Kit:

- 1. Perform backups of data prior to upgrade.
- 2. Verify operating system versions, and upgrade operating systems to supported versions and patch levels.
- 3. Upgrade switch firmware.
- 4. Upgrade the Solution Software Kit.
- 5. Quiesce all I/O and unmount all file systems for the server being updated before proceeding.
- 6. If you are installing an operating system that uses Secure Path, upgrade Secure Path to the latest version at this time.
- 7. Upgrade the ACS software.

NOTE: Solely for the purpose of performing upgrades to ACS, the Solution Software Kit supports ACS V8.6. HP recommends that you avoid mixing ACS versions in the same Storage Area Network (SAN).

The extended interoperability of the heterogeneous SAN allows you to mix several types of *StorageWorks* storage systems. HP recommends that you adhere to the following configuration rules when different storage products are shared in the same SAN:

• HSG80 ACS Version 8.6 and EVA VCS Version 2.0—Use ACS Solution Software Version 8.6 (if SWCC Version 2.4 components are desired) and VCS Version 2.0-compatible multi-bus software and drivers.

- HSG80 ACS Version 8.7 and EVA VCS Version 2.0—Use ACS Solution Software Version 8.7B (includes SWCC Version 2.5) and VCS Version 2.0-compatible multi-bus software/drivers.
- HSG80 ACS Version 8.6 and HSG80 ACS Version 8.7—Use ACS Solution Software Version 8.7B (includes SWCC Version 2.5).

NOTE: Any multi-bus storage system configuration that includes EVA VCS Version 2.0 requires multi-bus support. ACS Version 8.7-compatible Secure Path versions on page 25 and HBA drivers are compatible with VCS 2.0.

- 3. Using your Secure Path Software CD, install Secure Path V3.1A for Windows or Secure Path V4.0-1 or higher for Windows in accordance with the instructions provided with that product. If you are using Secure Path V3.1A, apply the Secure Path V3.1A for Windows SP 3 update.
- 4. Shutdown the server.
- 5. Connect the FCA fibre cables to the switch(es).
- 6. Restart the server.

Updating the Solution Software Kit with Secure Path on Windows NT/2000 Server

The following procedures demonstrate how to upgrade your Solution Software Kit, in conjunction with your Secure Path software, in a multi-bus failover environment.

Updating an Existing Standalone Server

To update an existing standalone server by using Secure Path in multi-bus failover mode, complete the following steps:

- 1. Log in to an account with administrator privileges.
- 2. Stop all applications that access Secure Path storage.
- 3. Stop the SWCC STEAM agent in Services.
- 4. Click Add/Remove Program on the Control Panel and uninstall:
 - SWCC
 - *Large LUN* utility (if installed)

NOTE: Do not restart the server at this time if instructed to do so.

- 5. Insert your Secure Path Software CD and install Secure Path V3.1A for Windows or Secure Path V4.0-1 or higher for Windows in accordance with the instructions provided with the product.
- 6. If you are using Secure Path V3.1A for Windows, apply the Secure Path V3.1A for Windows SP 3 update.
- 7. If you are using Secure Path V4.0-1 or higher for Windows, apply the Secure Path V4.0-1 or higher update.

- 8. Reboot the server.
- 9. Insert your Solution Software Kit CD and click Solution Software for Windows.
 - a. Click **Perform Multi Driver Update** to install the HBA driver.
 - b. Click **Fibre Channel Software Setup**, and then choose one of the multi-bus Fibre Channel setups, based on your configuration.
 - c. Click **SWCC** (optional) to install SWCC components.

NOTE: The latest *Large LUN* utility must be installed if the storage system is used prior to upgrading ACS to Version 8.7-1 and a Large LUN configuration was previously employed.

10. Restart the server.

Updating an Existing Cluster

To update an existing cluster by using Secure Path in multi-bus failover mode, complete the following steps:

- 1. Log in to the server with an account with administrator privileges.
- 2. Make note of your original configuration by using Cluster Administrator, and then move disk resources to the other cluster node. The node being updated should not have any disk resources online.
- 3. Set all cluster groups to **Prevent failback**, by using Cluster Manager, while the upgrade is taking place.

NOTE: The Cluster Service must continue to run on all nodes. Stopping the Cluster Service during this procedure could result in a Cluster Service failure and subsequent reinstallation.

- 4. Stop the SWCC STEAM agent in **Services**.
- 5. Select Add/Remove Program from the Control Panel, and uninstall:
 - SWCC
 - *Large LUN* utility (if installed)

NOTE: Do *not* restart the system at this time if instructed to do so.

- 6. Insert your Secure Path Software CD and install Secure Path V3.1A for Windows or Secure Path V4.0-1 or higher for Windows in accordance with the instructions provided with that product.
- 7. If you are using Secure Path V3.1A for Windows, apply the Secure Path V3.1A for Windows SP 3 update.

- 8. If you are using Secure Path V4.0-1 or higher for Windows, apply the Secure Path V4.0-1 or higher update.
- 9. Insert your Solution Software Kit CD and click Solution Software for Windows.
 - a. Click Perform Multi Driver Update to install the HBA driver.
 - b. Click **Fibre Channel Software Setup**, and then choose one of the multi-bus Fibre Channel setups, based on your configuration.
 - c. Click SWCC (optional) to install SWCC components.

NOTE: The latest *Large LUN* utility must be installed if the storage system is used prior to upgrading ACS to Version 8.7-1 and a Large LUN configuration was previously employed.

- 10. Restart the updated cluster node.
- 11. Repeat step 2 through step 10 for the next cluster node.
- 12. After all cluster nodes are upgraded, restore all cluster groups to their original **Prevent failback** setting, and restore storage groups to their original configuration.

Upgrading ACS

The following subsections provide background and some detailed information applicable to the HSG80 ACS V8.7-1 Update. HP recommends that you review the *hp StorageWorks HSG80 Array Controller V8.7 Maintenance and Service Guide* before attempting to use the rolling upgrade feature.

NOTE: The following rolling upgrade procedures for ACS V8.7-1 (variants F, G, and S) take precedence over rolling upgrade procedures documented for variants F, G, and S in the *hp StorageWorks HSG80 Array Controller V8.7 Maintenance and Service Guide*.

CAUTION: Failure to follow the recommendations and instructions for the rolling upgrade feature may result in data loss or system inoperability. See the "Operating Constraints" section for additional information.

CAUTION: Before attempting the ACS upgrade procedure in the "Rolling Upgrades" section, verify that the subsystem is in a stable state. The HSG80 array controller **Reset** button should be flashing, and all adjacent LEDs should be off (no light). Failure to perform this verification may result in the loss of data or leave the HSG80 array controller in an unusable state.

About Rolling Upgrades

There are two ways to upgrade the ACS:

- Using the rolling upgrade procedure—Rolling upgrades take advantage of HSG80 array controller failover capabilities and allow you to upgrade the ACS while I/O activity continues.
- Using the shutdown upgrade procedure—The shutdown upgrade procedure requires you to halt I/O activity, shut down your controllers, and dismount your host systems and any associated units.

NOTE: Shutdown upgrade procedures are documented in the *hp StorageWorks HSG80 Array Controller V8.7 Maintenance and Service Guide* that shipped with the HSG80 array controller. You can download a copy of this guide from the HP website at <u>http://www.hp.com</u>. Follow the storage-related links to access technical documentation for the HSG80 array controllers, which are part of the HP *StorageWorks* Enterprise Modular Array and the HP *StorageWorks* Modular Array.

Rolling Upgrade Procedure

The following rolling upgrade procedures for ACS V8.7-1 (variants F, G, and S) take precedence over rolling upgrade procedures documented for variants F, G, and S in the *hp StorageWorks HSG80 Array Controller V8.7 Maintenance and Service Guide*.

NOTE: For upgrade procedures for variant P of ACS, see the *hp StorageWorks HSG80 Array Controller V8.7 Maintenance and Service Guide*.

To perform a rolling upgrade, complete the following steps. For clarity, the terms *Controller A*, *Controller B*, *HSGA*>, and *HSGB*> are used to help you identify which controller is used.

CAUTION: Attempt a rolling upgrade *only* when each controller in a dual-redundant configuration is at least 50% idle. Otherwise, I/Os may be dropped during the upgrade.

1. Connect a PC or terminal to the maintenance port of Controller A, if not already done.

NOTE: If you have several servers with multiple LUNs in your storage area network (SAN), HP recommends that you verify that all units are online by using the SHOW UNITS FULL CLI command. Afterwards, use the Secure Path Manager to move all LUNs to the controller to be updated last. (LUNs may be removed by either controller.)

2. Verify the utilization percentage for *each* controller by entering the following RUN command:

HSGA> RUN VTDPY

The idle percentage for the HSG80 array controller is the first item displayed on the second line of the VTDPY display. If the HSG80 array controller is less than 50% idle and the screen display indicates activity, the processing load is reduced. See your operating system documentation for more information on reducing the processing load.

NOTE: The default VTDPY display refreshes every ten seconds.

To exit VTDPY, press <Ctrl> C, and then enter the following:

HSGA> exit

- 3. Repeat step 2 above on the OTHER_CONTROLLER.
- 4. Disable the Command Console LUN (CCL) prior to upgrading if the HSG80 array controller is running in SCSI-2 mode and the CCL is enabled:
 - a. Type the following command to verify the current SCSI mode:

HSGA> SHOW THIS_CONTROLLER

- b. Record the status for restoration in step 23.
- c. Disable the CCL by using the following command: HSGA> SET THIS_CONTROLLER NOCOMMAND_CONSOLE_LUN
- 5. Delete all SNAPSHOT units, if you are upgrading from ACS V8.6S-*x* to V8.7S-*x*.
 - a. Identify all SNAPSHOT units by using the following command: HSGA> SHOW UNITS FULL
 - b. Record the configuration for each SNAPSHOT unit for restoration in step 22.
 - c. Individually delete all SNAPSHOT units by using the following command: HSGA> DELETE <snapshot-unit-name>
- 6. Verify that all appropriate units were deleted by using the following command: HSGA> SHOW UNITS FULL

NOTE: If any other SNAPSHOT units exist, repeat step 5 until they are all deleted.

7. Identify and record the current cache flush timer value by using the following command:

```
HSGA> SHOW THIS_CONTROLLER
```

The following text is only a portion of the resulting display. An arrow points to the pertinent status indication:

Cache:

```
256 megabyte write cache, version 0022
Cache is GOOD
No unflushed data in cache
CACHE_FLUSH_TIMER=DEFAULT (10 seconds)
```

NOTE: The cache flush timer value is displayed in the caching parameters section. This parameter is modified during the procedure and must be restored in step 20.

8. For each unit, identify and record the unit write-back cache, read-ahead cache, read cache, and Preferred Path characteristics by using the following command:

HSGA> SHOW UNITS FULL

These characteristics are modified during the upgrade procedure and must be restored in step 21.

NOTE: The switch for Preferred Path is available only with a multi-bus configuration. It is not available in the transparent failover mode.

9. Set the cache flush timer to 1 second by using the following commands:

HSGA> SET THIS_CONTROLLER CACHE_FLUSH_TIMER=1

HSGA> SET OTHER_CONTROLLER CACHE_FLUSH_TIMER=1

10. Clear any unit with the PREFERRED_PATH switch set, by using the following command as required for each unit:

HSGA> SET <unit-name> NOPREFERRED_PATH

11. Disable write-back, read-ahead, and read caching on all units by using the following command as required for each unit:

```
HSGA> SET <unit-name> NOWRITEBACK_CACHE NOREADAHEAD_CACHE NOREAD_CACHE
```

NOTE: The xxx_CACHE switches must be entered in the specified order, or the command is rejected.

12. Determine whether all data was flushed from the cache module by using the following command on both controllers:

HSGA> SHOW THIS_CONTROLLER

HSGA> SHOW OTHER_CONTROLLER

The following text is only a portion of the resulting display. An arrow points to the pertinent status indication:

No unflushed data in cache

CACHE_FLUSH_TIMER=1 SECOND

NOTE: Repeat step 12 on both controllers (THIS_CONTROLLER and OTHER_CONTROLLER) until no unwritten data remains in either cache module memory. If unwritten data is present after several minutes, verify that the WRITEBACK_CACHE switch is disabled on all units by using the SHOW UNITS FULL command. For any units with the WRITEBACK_CACHE switch enabled, return to step 11 and proceed.

13. Shut down Controller B by using the following command:

HSGA> SHUTDOWN OTHER_CONTROLLER

NOTE: Disregard any messages pertaining to misconfigured controllers or failover status.




Figure 1: HSG80 array controller Reset button and LEDs

NOTE: After Controller B shuts down, the **Reset** button **①** and the first three LEDs **②** light up (see Figure 1). Proceed only after the **Reset** button stops flashing and remains on.

14. Verify that all units failed over to Controller A by using the following command to show the status of each unit:

HSGA> SHOW UNITS FULL

The following text is only a portion of the resulting display. An arrow points to the pertinent status indication:

15. Run VTDPY to verify that all units are online and that there is no I/O activity by entering the following CLI command:

HSGA> RUN VTDPY

The idle percentage for the HSG80 array controller is the first item displayed on the second line of the VTDPY display. If the HSG80 array controller is less than 50% idle and the screen display indicates activity, the processing load should be reduced.

NOTE: You must wait a minimum of 60 seconds to allow for the failover and cache-flushing process to complete. The VTDPY display refreshes every 10 seconds.

To exit VTDPY, press <Ctrl> C, and then enter the following:

HSGA> exit

16. Upgrade the software on Controller B by performing the following steps:

NOTE: After step 16 is successfully performed, the previous ACS version cannot be restored to this subsystem.

- a. Remove the program card ESD cover from Controller B.
- b. Press and hold the HSG80 array controller **Reset** button while ejecting the old program card.
- c. Release the **Reset** button.
- d. Press and hold the **Reset** button while inserting the new program card (ACS V8.7-1).
- e. Release the **Reset** button. Controller B restarts.

NOTE: An HSG80 array controller restart can take as long as 60 seconds, indicated by the temporary cycling of the port LEDs and a flashing **Reset** button. Disregard messages about misconfigured controllers or failover status. When Controller B restarts, it automatically shuts down Controller A.

- f. Install the program card ESD cover on Controller B.
- 17. Verify that Controller B completed initialization:
 - a. Connect the PC or terminal to the maintenance port of Controller B.
 - b. Make sure that the CLI prompt for Controller B appears.
 - c. Verify that Controller A is shut down. (The **Reset** button and the first three LEDs light up. See Figure 1.) Proceed only after the **Reset** button stops flashing and remains on.
- 18. Run VTDPY to verify that all Controller B units are online and that there is I/O activity by entering the following CLI command:

HSGB> RUN VTDPY

NOTE: You must wait a minimum of 60 seconds to allow for the failover and cache-flushing process to complete. The VTDPY display refreshes every 10 seconds.

To exit VTDPY, press <Ctrl> C, and then enter the following:

HSGB> exit

- 19. Install the new (V8.7-1) program card on Controller A by performing the following steps:
 - a. Remove the program card ESD cover from Controller A.

- b. Press and hold the HSG80 array controller **Reset** button while ejecting the old program card.
- c. Release the **Reset** button.
- d. Press and hold the **Reset** button while inserting the new program card (ACS V8.7-1).
- e. Release the **Reset** button.

NOTE: An HSG80 array controller restart can take as long as 60 seconds, indicated by the temporary cycling of the port LEDs and a flashing **Reset** button. Disregard messages about misconfigured controllers or failover status.

- f. Install the program card ESD cover on Controller A.
- g. Connect the PC or terminal to the maintenance port of Controller A.

NOTE: Wait for the PC or terminal to display the CLI prompt before proceeding.

20. After the CLI prompt is displayed for Controller A, restore the CACHE_FLUSH_TIMER to the value recorded in step 9 by using the following commands:

```
HSGA> SET THIS_CONTROLLER CACHE_FLUSH_TIMER=<n>
```

HSGA> SET OTHER_CONTROLLER CACHE_FLUSH_TIMER=<n>

21. For each unit, restore the PREFERRED_PATH, WRITEBACK_CACHE, READ_CACHE, and READAHEAD_CACHE switch settings as recorded in step 10 and step 11 by using the following command:

```
HSGA> SET <unit-name> PREFERRED_PATH=THIS_CONTROLLER
WRITEBACK_CACHE READ_CACHE READAHEAD_CACHE
```

- 22. Restore all SNAPSHOT units removed in step 5.
- 23. If the CCL was disabled in step 4, enable it by using the following command:

HSGA> SET THIS_CONTROLLER COMMAND_CONSOLE_LUN

24. Disconnect the PC or terminal from the maintenance port of Controller A.

SWCC Agent Configuration Utility and the Displayed ACS Firmware Version

After upgrading from ACS V8.6 (any variant or patch) to ACS V8.7-1, the SWCC Agent Configuration utility displays the previous ACS version before the upgrade (same variant) on the **NT Agent Configuration Step 3 of 3** screen.

NOTE: If you installed ACS 8.7 and then upgraded to ACS 8.7-1, SWCC displays the proper ACS version number on the **NT Configuration Step 3 of 3** dialog box.

Figure 2 shows where the ACS version displays ③ the previous version (before the upgrade) in SWCC after you upgrade from ACS V8.6 to V8.7-1.

To verify the correct version of ACS on the HSG80 array controller in this scenario, always use the SHOW THIS_CONTROLLER or SHOW OTHER_CONTROLLER CLI command from a CLI window or any CLI prompt.

Disk Partitioning

ACS allows partitioning of disk drives or storagesets for improved device management. A partition appears to the operating system as a single virtual disk. Up to eight partitions may be created per storageset or disk drive. Disk partitioning is supported under all failover modes supported by your operating system.

SNAPSHOT

ACS with SNAPSHOT capability provides a quick and efficient way to make a point-in-time copy of a storage container's data. SNAPSHOT freezes a map of the container's data, which can be separated and used for backup or testing and manipulation without having an impact on the original data. After the SNAPSHOT, the original data can continue to be updated and utilized while the SNAPSHOT copy remains unchanged.

When the need for the duplicate copy of data has ended, a new snap of a different storage container can be made and the process repeated. SNAPSHOT eliminates much of the overhead associated with mirroring and cloning since the SNAPSHOT is dissolved without having to re-merge the data.

SNAPSHOT is enabled when the following CLI command is entered:

HSG80> ADD SNAPSHOT_UNITS

See the *HSG80 Array Controller ACS Version 8.7 CLI Reference Guide* for additional syntax details.

The SNAPSHOT unit can be presented to the host. The SNAPSHOT unit remains until it is deleted.

NOTE: SNAPSHOT functionality requires either ACS Version 8.7P or ACS Version 8.7S.

IMPORTANT: ACS SNAPSHOT capability requires 512 MB of cache memory.

Write History Logging

Write history logging, available to users of ACS Version 8.7P, uses a log unit to log a history of write commands and data from the host on the initiator side in either of the following situations:

- The target is inaccessible.
- The initiator site data needs to be synchronized during a planned failover.

Mini-merge—If the target becomes inaccessible, the writes that would have gone to the target are logged to the association set's assigned log unit. An inaccessible target in this context refers to both links or target controllers shutting down. When the target becomes accessible, a full copy is not necessary. Only those host writes that occurred while the links were down are reissued. This is referred to as a *mini-merge*. If a full copy was in progress at the time of the disconnect, write history logging is not initiated and the full copy is restarted when the target is accessible again.

Fast-Failback—During a planned failover, if write history logging was enabled at the target site, then when the failback is performed, the initiator site is synchronized through a process called *fast-failback*. The writes that would have gone to the initiator are logged to the association set's log unit. Only those writes that occurred since the failover are reissued. A full copy is not necessary.

Dynamic Volume Expansion

Dynamic Volume Expansion creates a specialized volume called a concatset (short for concatenation set) from a storageset that was given a unit number. Another storageset can then be added to the concatset by using the SET CONCATSET command. See the *HSG80 Array Controller ACS Version 8.7 CLI Reference Guide* for syntax details.

Dynamic Disks

The use of SNAPSHOTs and SNAPCLONEs in HP SANs is not supported in a Windows 2000 environment if the SNAPSHOT or SNAPCLONE is presented to the same Windows 2000 host as the LUN from which the SNAPSHOT or SNAPCLONE was created. SNAPSHOTs and SNAPCLONEs are features of the HSG80 and HSV110 controller based HP Storage systems. All Dynamic disks on a system have information in their metadata about the other dynamic disks that exist on the system. When Windows is presented with 2 dynamic disks that have the same information on them, it does not have code to resolve the conflict.

Configuration Rules

The following list defines maximum configuration rules for the controller:

- 128 visible LUNs/200 assignable unit numbers
 - In SCSI-2 mode, the CCL is disabled, resulting in 128 visible LUNs.
 - In SCSI-3 mode, the CCL is enabled, resulting in 127 visible LUNs and one CCL.
- 1.024 TB storageset size
- 96 host connections
- 84 physical devices
- 20 RAID 3/5 storagesets
- 30 RAID 3/5 and RAID 1 storagesets (see Note)

• 45 RAID 3/5, RAID 1, and RAID 0 storagesets (see Note)

NOTE: For the previous two storageset configurations, this is a combined maximum, limited to no more than 20 RAID 3/5 storagesets.

- 8 partitions of a storageset or individual disk
- 6 physical devices per RAID 1 storageset (mirrorset)
- 14 physical devices per RAID 3/5 storageset (RAIDset)
- 24 physical devices per RAID 0 storageset (stripeset)
- 45 physical devices per RAID 0+1 storageset (striped mirrorset)

SCSI-2 to SCSI-3 Migration

In order to extend interoperability within the heterogeneous SAN, *StorageWorks* highly recommends that customers begin migrating from SCSI-2 to SCSI-3 protocols. Moving to SCSI-3 allows greater diversity in the operating systems and storage products (including EVA) that comprise a SAN.

All migrations from SCSI-2 to SCSI-3 should be planned during scheduled downtime. SCSI migrations require a controller restart and most likely a server restart. Data contained on CCL units needs to be moved to new units once SCSI migration is complete.

CAUTION: Before attempting a SCSI-2 to SCSI-3 migration, it is extremely important that all data be backed up and that units be available for remapping CCL data. In addition, ensure that all redundant storagesets are in normal (non-reduced) mode.

When migrating from SCSI-2 to SCSI-3, the controller checks for controller unit D0 and does not change modes until D0 (at all presented offsets) is deleted. One or more LUNs are lost after the mode change. If you are planning to move from SCSI-2 to SCSI-3, back up your data first. The data in LUN 0 (and any other offsets that map to LUN 0) that was used in SCSI-2 requires that the data be moved to a different LUN. It may be necessary to retrieve this data from a backup.

IMPORTANT: If multi-bus failover configurations or server clustering are employed in the environment, there may be additional considerations regarding CCL usage during SCSI migration procedures. Please see your multi-bus failover or server clustering documentation prior to implementation.

In addition, there may be OS-based limitations on SCSI-3 usage to consider, particularly in down-level versions of your OS. Please review your OS documentation prior to migration.

For more information, see the "What is the Command Console LUN?" and "Assigning Unit Numbers Depending on SCSI_VERSION" sections of Chapter 1 in the HSG80 ACS Solution Software Version 8.7 Installation and Configuration Guide.

Operating Constraints

This section describes the operating constraints for ACS Version 8.7. An operating constraint is a limitation placed on the operation of the controller. Other constraints on host adapters or other system components may also apply. Keep these constraints in mind to avoid problems and to help achieve the maximum performance from your controller. See the documentation that came with your host server for more details.

External Cache Battery

StorageWorks recommends that you replace the External Cache Battery (ECB) every two years to prevent battery failure.

If you are shutting down your controller for longer than one day, complete the additional steps in "Shutting Down the Subsystem" in the *HSG80 Array Controller ACS Version 8.7 Maintenance and Service Guide*. This prevents the ECB from discharging during planned power outages.

Dual External Cache Battery Failures

The array controller cache policy provides for proper handling of a single ECB failure as described in the *HSG80 Array Controller ACS Version 8.7 Troubleshooting Reference Guide*. For dual ECB failures, it states that no failover occurs. For this release, if a dual ECB failure is detected, both controllers are restarted.

SAN Boot Procedures

Booting from the SAN is supported for Windows NT and Windows 2000. SAN boot procedures are available on the *StorageWorks* website.

Using FRUTIL to Insert a New Controller

When using FRUTIL to insert a new controller in a dual-redundant controller configuration, you see a new set of instructions after the new controller was inserted:

If the other controller did not restart, follow these steps:

- 1. Press and hold the **Reset** button on the other controller.
- 2. Remove and re-insert the program card for the other controller.
- 3. Release the **Reset** button.

NOTE: Whenever you are running FRUTIL you must quiesce all I/O.

FRUTIL Limitation

This limitation applies to users of ACS Version 8.7P with DRM only.

FRUTIL cannot be run in remote copy set environments on the target side specifically when I/O is in progress.

If the host load was stopped, you can run FRUTIL on the initiator or target. If the host load is not quiesced and FRUTIL is run while remote copy I/O is running, the normalization process is reset.

Saving Your Configuration

When enabled, the SAVE_CONFIGURATION function allows you to do the following (supported on single controller configurations only):

- Save a configuration to a disk or storageset. The configuration may be retrieved later and downloaded onto a replacement controller.
- Retain code patches to the ACS software.

Saving a Configuration to Previously Initialized Storagesets

If any storageset within the configuration was previously initialized with the INITIALIZE *container-name* SAVE_CONFIGURATION command to save your configuration to disk, it is not necessary to reconfigure your devices with a new controller. SAVE_CONFIGURATION also retains code patch information to the software. This option is supported on single controller configurations only.

ACS Version 8.7 saves any installed software patches on disks initialized with the SAVE_CONFIGURATION command. To replace a controller and restore the configuration from a disk, you do not have to reinstall any software patches.

Configuration information cannot be retrieved from storagesets created on other HSx controllers (for example, HSD, HSJ, or HSZ controllers). You can only restore a configuration from a configuration saved on this or another HSG80 array controller.

Avoiding Problem Situations

Under certain conditions, you may experience unusual array controller behavior. This section presents information to help you avoid such situations and to recover from them if they occur.

Adding, Moving, and Changing Devices

The array controller maintains a configuration map of device types and locations. This map is used to communicate with devices. If you add, move, or change a device while the array controller is powered off without first changing the array controller configuration, the array controller is not able to communicate with the changed device when it returns to service.

If a device is removed by mistake while the array controller is off, delete all containers associated with the removed device after power was restored to the array controller.

If a device is replaced while the array controller is off, install the replacement device before restoring power to the array controller. Once power is restored, use the DELETE DISK CLI command to remove the disk from the configuration. Then use the ADD DISK CLI command to add the new device. This correctly removes the failed device and adds the new device after restoring power to the array controller.

See the *HSG80 Array Controller ACS Version 8.7 CLI Reference Guide* for details on CLI command usage and syntax.

See the *HSG80 Array Controller ACS Version 8.7 Maintenance and Service Guide* for correct device removal and addition procedures.

Moving Storagesets

Move only *normal* storagesets. Do not move storagesets that are *reconstructing* or were *reduced*.



CAUTION: Ensure all storagesets are in *normal* mode prior to moving them, or data corruption occurs.

Replacing Array Controllers, Cache Modules, or External Cache Battery Storage Building Blocks

You can replace the array controller, cache module, or external cache battery (ECB) storage building block (SBB) while the storage system is shut down. However, you must enter the SHUTDOWN THIS_CONTROLLER command prior to shutting down the storage system in order to make configuration changes. If two array controllers are configured in a dual-redundant configuration, you must first enter the SHUTDOWN OTHER_CONTROLLER command.

These commands instruct the array controllers to flush all unwritten data from the cache modules and discontinue all I/O activity. For more information regarding the SHUTDOWN controller command, see the *HSG80 Array Controller ACS Version 8.7 CLI Reference Guide*. For information on maintenance and replacement of the array controller, cache module, and external cache battery, see the *HSG80 Array Controller ACS Version 8.7 Maintenance and Service Guide*.

Disk Resource Pending Timeout for Large Configurations

In order to ensure continuous operation of Disk Resources across SAN perturbations with Disk Resource counts greater than eight, it is recommended that the Pending Timeout parameter for each Disk Resource be increased from 180 seconds to 360 seconds.

To view and set the Pending Timeout parameter:

- 1. Open the Microsoft Cluster Administrator.
- 2. Select a **Disk Group** resource in the left pane.
- 3. Right click each Disk Resource in right pane, one at a time, and select Properties.
- 4. Select the Advanced tab from the Properties menu.
- 5. Locate the **Pending Timeout** value and change it to **360**.
- 6. Click OK.

Unit Offsets

Setting unit offsets requires a host reboot for the newly set offsets to take effect.

SWCC SCSI Connection

The SWCC Client SCSI connection can sometimes produce the following error message when trying to connect through the CCL:

```
Error scanning subsystem. Command Execution Error: [DeviceIOControl Error:]
```

Additionally, physical devices may not appear in the **Select Device** drop-down list. The SWCC CLI Window terminates if the **New Window** icon is selected, or if **New** is selected from the **File** Menu, followed by clicking the **Cancel** button on the **Connection Selection** dialog box. If the connection becomes lost, restart the Client application. *StorageWorks* strongly recommends that you use the SWCC Agent to manage the storage system.

Host Operating System Notes

The following section lists host-specific operating notes.

Host Operating System Support of Multi-Bus Failover

Multi-bus failover is supported on the Windows NT, Windows 2000, and Windows Server 2003 operating system through the use of Secure Path software. See "Secure Path Software", page 25, for version compatibility and restrictions.

Upgrading DS-KGPSA-BC Firmware

Use this procedure to upgrade the DS-KGPSA-BC HBA firmware from Version 2.x to Version 3.x (for example, V2.20x7 to V3.20x7).

Version 3.x firmware is Fibre Channel Standard compliant and uses a different World Wide Name (WWN) for Host and Port (2xxx-xxxx-xxxx format for Host and 1xxx-xxxx-xxxx for Port, where xxx-xxxx-xxxx is identical in both).

The new WWN structure creates new Host Connections on the HSG80 controllers for the HBA. The original host connections are marked "offline" and are no longer usable.

To maintain server access to storage units behind the HSG80 controllers, change the storage units' access to use the new Host Connections.

Use the following procedure to upgrade your DS-KGPSA-BC HBA firmware from Version 2.x to Version 3.x:

1. Connect a PC or terminal to the maintenance port of Controller A and get a listing of the host connections by typing the command:

HSGA> SHOW CONNECTIONS

The resulting display should appear similar to the following:

- 2. Note the WWNs of the ADAPTER_ID of the new connections.
- 3. Find the offline connections with the same ADAPTER_ID WWNs and note the unit offsets.
- 4. Type the following command to get a list of all storage units and the host connections whose access is enabled:

HSGA> SHOW UNIT FULL

5. For all of the units with access enabled for offline connections, type:

```
HSGA> SET <unit name> DISABLE_ACCESS=<offline host connection
name #1>
HSGA> SET <unit name> DISABLE_ACCESS=<offline host connection
name #2>
```

6. Delete the offline host connections by typing:

```
HSGA> DELETE <offline host connection name #1>
HSGA> DELETE <offline host connection name #2>
...
```

7. Rename the new connections to the name of the previously matching offline host connection name by typing:

```
HSGA> RENAME !NEWCONnn <offline host connection name #1>
HSGA> RENAME !NEWCONnn <offline host connection name #2>
....
```

8. Enable access for these new host connections to the storage units by typing:

```
HSGA> SET <unit name> ENABLE_ACCESS=<offline host connection
name #1>
HSGA> SET <unit name> ENABLE_ACCESS=<offline host connection
name #2>
....
```

Windows NT, Windows 2000, and Windows Server 2003

- Windows NT, Windows 2000, and Windows Server 2003 can run MSCS software. See documents that come with Microsoft's software kits for instructions on setting up Microsoft clusters.
- There is no Hot Plug support for FC HBAs under Windows NT 4.0, Windows 2000, and Windows Server 2003 at this time. Check the *StorageWorks* Support website for updates.
- Windows NT and Windows 2000 support SCSI-2 and SCSI-3 modes. See the *HSG80 ACS Solution Software Version 8.7 Installation and Configuration Guide* that comes with this kit for more information.
- *StorageWorks* recommends that you load software directly from the Solution Software CD-ROM when installing drivers and running the Fibre Channel Setup utility. You may experience problems on some systems if you first copy the CD-ROM contents to a disk drive and then install from there.
- Windows 2000 dynamic volumes are supported in transparent failover configurations or in Secure Path Version 4.0x multi-bus configurations.
- Cloning a Windows 2000 dynamic disk is allowed. However, either the CLONE or the original can be mounted to the same host but not both.

Windows NT Specific Notes

• Fibre Channel software setup handles HszDisk and HS_Service installation. This is sometimes referred to as HSZinstall in the documentation.

IMPORTANT: Do not use the Large LUN model with Windows NT Service Pack 5 under any circumstances. Windows NT Service Pack 6A is the stated minimum for this Solution Software.

- In a situation where you are replacing a server with another and using the existing drives (storagesets) behind the array controllers, you may find drive to drive letter mapping changes. During such a system changeover, remap drives to drive letters using the Disk Administrator to restore proper access to your data.
- To delete the 8 MB EISA-type partition on new disk drives, as discussed in the "Disk Device Support", page 18, create a unit and delete the partition in Disk Administrator.

Windows 2000 Specific Notes

- New Universal Disk Drives (or units that are migrated from SmartArray controllers usage) being configured into storageset members need to be initially written to with DILX (a diagnostic utility on the HSG storage systems). DILX only operates on units. Therefore, the new disks must be configured into a unit prior to running DILX. Optionally, the HSUTIL format disk utility may be used on a disk device.
- The Fibre Channel Setup utility installs HS_Service and HsxDisk software components. These are similar to HS_Service and HszDisk in the Windows NT setup procedure.
- There are two situations in which drive-letter remapping might occur and that could affect access to data by programs you may need to run. The first situation is one in which you replace one server with another. The second is a situation in which you simply replace an FC HBA in one of your systems. During such a system or adapter changeover, be sure to manually remap drives to drive letters using Disk Manager. This restores proper access to your data.
- If you replace an FC HBA in a server, you need to reinstall the HBA driver and then rerun the Fibre Channel Setup utility. This is so that Windows 2000 can automatically reload the original driver for this adapter and reset many of the important registry settings. New connections are created on the HSG controller. Those connections should be renamed and assigned to the appropriate units.

For more information about installing the adapter, see the *HSG80 ACS Solution Software Version 8.7 Installation and Configuration Guide* and use the software on the Solution Software CD-ROM.

Upgrading from Windows NT 4.0 to Windows 2000 or Windows Server 2003

If you are upgrading from Windows NT 4.0 to Windows 2000 or Windows Server 2003, you must remove the software components installed by the previous version of the Fibre Channel Setup utility. Follow these steps:

- 1. Remove the software components installed from the previous Fibre Channel Setup utility. To do this, locate the previous CD-ROM and run the utility. Follow the procedures in it to remove components. Alternately, you can use the **Add/Remove Programs** applet.
- 2. Upgrade from Windows NT 4.0 to Windows 2000 or Windows Server 2003 as instructed by Microsoft's documentation.
- 3. Reboot.
- 4. Install the HBA driver upgrade as instructed in the HSG80 ACS Solution Software Version 8.7 Installation and Configuration Guide.
- 5. Run the Fibre Channel Setup utility to complete your installation.

Registry Growth in Windows

The Windows plug-and-play architecture has a limitation on the number of plug-and-play device entries that can be added to the registry. Whenever devices are added or removed, or SNAPSHOT is created or deleted, entries are added to the registry by the Plug-and-Play manager, potentially causing the registry to grow beyond the allowed capacity.

If more than 700 entries are in the registry, the next time the system reboots for any reason, the following error message occurs before the operating system boots up:

"Failed to load Windows 2000 due to a file missing or corrupt in the \WINNT\SYSTEM32\CONFIG\SYSTEM directory."

Please see the Microsoft Knowledge Base article (Q269075), which provides more information about the registry growth problem.

Large LUNs for Windows NT and Windows 2000

Enabling Large LUNs allows a Windows NT or Windows 2000 server to have access to LUNs beyond the 0-7 range, and to access more than 8 LUNs per target. The host can access unit D10 by leaving the connection offset at 0.

The maximum number of LUNs supported is 256 per storage system. If using Secure Path Version 3.1A SP1, the maximum number of LUNs is 64 per storage system. If using Secure Path Version 4.0x, the maximum number of LUNs is 256 per storage system. The LUNs can be contiguous or non contiguous.

NOTE: Large LUNs are supported on Windows NT, Windows 2000 Server, and Windows 2000 Advanced Server.

Large LUN Utility for Windows

The Large LUN utility is available for download at the *StorageWorks* website:

NOTE: The Large LUN utility is unnecessary if ACS Version 8.6 or higher is running alone or in conjunction with Secure Path software, which has built-in support.

Controller Configuration

It is recommended that you set the SCSI_VERSION to SCSI-3 for maximum availability.

- Multi-bus failover mode (with Secure Path Version 3.1A SP1)—Support for 64 LUNs per storage system (SCSI-2 mode) or 63 LUNs + 1 CCL (SCSI-3). These LUN numbers must be between 0 and 63.
- Multi-bus failover mode (with Secure Path Version 4.0x)—Support for 128 LUNs per storage system (SCSI-2 mode) or 127 LUNs + 1 CCL (SCSI-3). These LUN numbers must be between 0 and 199.
- Transparent failover mode—Support for 128 LUNs per storage system (SCSI-2 mode) or 127 LUNs + 1 CCL (SCSI-3). These LUN numbers must be between 0 and 199.

Known Limitations

In Windows 2000, if any LUN greater than 7 is removed and a subsequent disk rescan is performed, the **Found New Hardware** wizard may ask you to finish the installation of the device that was removed. The Device Manager may show the device with a yellow warning icon on it. A reboot of the system completely removes the device.

 $\ensuremath{\text{NOTE:}}$ Virtual Disk Wizard in multi-bus failover mode is not supported with the Secure Path driver.

Documentation Anomalies

The following are known additions and corrections to the HSG80 ACS Solution Software Version 8.7 Installation and Configuration Guide.

• In order to successfully perform a rolling upgrade on controllers connected to Windows 2000 hosts, the change to "Solution Software Upgrade Procedures," found on page 3-24, must be observed. See sections "Disk Partitioning", page 40, and "Rolling Upgrades", page 27, of these Release Notes for further details.
